Partnership Agreement

Our school has an educational partnership agreement with the Yokohama National University and the graduate school of interdisciplinary research.

Yokosuka High School has implemented a career education program called "Yokoko Academia" as part of its cooperation with universities.

This program started in 2010 as a unique attempt by Yokosuka High School to invite university professors from the Tokyo-area such as the Faculty of Science and Technology at Yokohama National University, and Keio University for the humanities and social sciences. The purpose of this course is to pursue knowledge with an eye toward the future keeping in mind the university entrance examinations.

School Events

We have a school festival, which is held every other year in late September, alternating between a sports festival and a cultural festival.

The Sports Festival

At sports festival, each class will get its own team colors and the total score is based on competition, cheerleading, and decoration.



The Cultural Festival

The cultural festival is held over two days and will be open to the public. Exhibitions and presentations by the cultural clubs are also held. Traditionally, part-time students operate food stalls, which is one of the few opportunities for them to interact with full-time students.

Sports DAY

All classes compete against each other. In each gender category, tournaments are held for soccer, volleyball, and table tennis. Scores for each event are converted to points and the total score will be decided.

The Track and Field Meet

Held every year in June at Iriyamazu Athletic Stadium. The overall score for each class is based on distance running, throwing, and jumping

History

- August 7, 1907

The establishment of Kanagawa Prefectural Fourth Junior High School was approved.

- June 20, 1908

The school opened and 20th of June was designated as the founding anniversary.

- March 1, 1913

The school was renamed Kanagawa Prefectural Yokosuka Junior High School.

- April 1 1938

Kanagawa Prefectural Yokosuka Meitoku Junior High School was established.

- April 1, 1943

As a result of the educational system reform, Meitoku Junior High School was abolished and the Yokosuka Junior High School night school was established in its place.

- April 1 1948

As a result of the educational system reform, the school was renamed Kanagawa Prefectural Yokosuka High School.

- April 1, 1950

The school became coeducational. October 10, 1957 - The new sports field was completed.

- March 28, 1959

The construction of a new school building began on the site of the old sports field, and the west side of Building A was completed.

- February 6, 1976

Building D was completed, and all four school buildings were completed.

- November 9, 1989

The current gymnasium was completed.

- July 5, 1994

The seminar house "Kionkan" was completed.

- April 1, 2002

The school was designated as a cooperating school for the Super Science High School (SSH) program.

- October 25, 2008

The 100th anniversary ceremony was held.

- April 1, 2016

The school was designated as a Super Science High School (SSH).
